# **Outstanding Contribution Award For Affiliates, Associates and Members of the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Medicine**

## **Eligibility, Adjudication and How to Enter**

### **Eligibility**

1. Entrants must be a current Affiliate, Associate or Member of the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Medicine.
2. The project or piece of work may have been undertaken as part of a collaborative effort by a team or group of individuals.
3. Entrants must have played a major role in the project and have made a significant individual contribution.
4. The project must normally have occurred or have had an impact during the two years leading up to the closing date.
5. The written submission must be the original work of the individual entrant.

### **Adjudication**

6. Entries will be judged by at least three judges selected annually by the Faculty.
7. At least one judge will be independent of the Faculty.
8. The winning entry will be the one that, in the opinion of the judging panel, demonstrates the greatest contribution towards the Faculty's mission (to advance the science and practice of pharmaceutical medicine by working to develop and maintain competence, ethics and integrity and the highest professional standards in the speciality for the benefit of the public).
9. The judges will look for an innovative project that has involved the entrant in going above and beyond what is expected as part of their job and evidence that a difference has been made.
10. Following adjudication and notification to the entrants of the result no further correspondence will be entered into relating to the adjudication.
11. Should the judging panel decide that in any given year no entries sufficiently meet the criteria for the award it may decide not to make an award that year.

### **How to Enter**

12. Submit a written, typed summary of no more than 1500 words which describes the project, its objectives, your role and what differences the project has made. Suitable projects would include for example technical or communications innovations, training or public education.
13. The closing date for entries is 30<sup>th</sup> June each year.
14. Entries should be sent by post to the Chief Executive, Faculty of Pharmaceutical Medicine, 1 St Andrew's Place, London, NW1 4LB
15. It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure that the project is not confidential.
16. Entrants must provide the name and contact details for a referee who will be prepared to vouch for the contribution that the entrant made to the project.

### **The Award**

17. The successful entrant will be presented with a medal and certificate at the Faculty's Annual Dinner to which they and a guest will be invited. The successful project will also be highlighted in the Faculty's newsletter.
